Mr.Hideaki Koriyama lived as a Hikikomori for about 10 years of his youth.

Hikikomori is a life withdrawn from society. He refused to leave his house or sometimes even from his room, isolating himself from society. It started when he was in high school. His mother suddenly died and he stopped going to school. His mother's death was certainly a shocking event, but Mr.Koriyama says having his father not take leadership at home was the biggest cause of his hikikomori life. No leadership at home made him feel free to withdraw himself from school.



In his interview he shares how his friends guided him to Christ and showed how hopeful life with Christ is. Knowing

that God forgives him and loves him no matter what he has done gave him courage to get out of his house and face reality. He now serves at Oasis Life Care at Rifu Kirisuto Kyokai in Miyagi.
